

### **Driving change.**

For more than a decade. The Addis Clinic has provided high-quality healthcare in some of the world's most challenging settings.



It was another difficult year in global health. Even as the United States rolled out its first vaccinations and even boosters for much of the population, the developing world lagged far behind in gaining access to lifesaving medicine. In the first year of the pandemic, there were anomalies among African countries experiencing fewer infections and less severe consequences. Many experts pointed to the continent's isolation from North America and Europe, the younger population, or possible other genetic reasons for higher resistance to earlier strains of the virus. But in 2021, all of that changed. Our own staff were among the first in their country to receive the vaccine. Yet still they, and many members of their families, fell ill, were hospitalized, or unfortunately passed away.

Our work in 2022 will be to honor the sacrifices of health workers around the world. They put their lives on the line for the health of their communities, their nations, and our world. It is not an anomaly that their lives will continue to be changed by the various mutations of this virus, the emergence of new diseases, regional instability, and a lack of access to the infrastructure, resources, and capital enjoyed by other countries. We will support our colleagues in Kenya, Ethiopia, and Somalia by providing tools, education, and resources. Thank you for your help to hold the line in Africa and to keep our health workers safer.

The Addis Clinic celebrated ten years of activity in a much different way than expected. We never imagined that we would be unable to celebrate in person, but we also never imagined the extraordinary difference we could make as a community of doctors, researchers, and activists. In ten years, we have delivered thousands of lifesaving diagnoses and treatment plans. We've also educated and mentored thousands of health workers in more than twenty countries. In the last year alone, we became an official NGO in Kenya and partnered with the U.S. Embassy in Nairobi, Kenya on an ongoing public health campaign. We are looking towards a bright future that incorporates providing high-quality healthcare mentorship, delivering continuing medical education, and discovering new insights into the use of telemedicine.





### **Theory of Change**

"We use digital health solutions to empower frontline health workers in delivering high-quality health services to ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all people at all ages."

### **Women and Girls**

In 2021 The Addis Clinic partnered with The Hijabi Mentorship Program, a women-led Kenyan nonprofit committed to empowering women and girls through education and access to medical care. Through this partnership, we've deployed mobile clinics in four highrisk areas with a goal of reaching 1,000 women and girls by the end of 2022. Program participants receive access to free medical checkups and live health and financial freedom seminars.

### Medical Education

When local health professionals join The Addis Clinic, they receive access to our live medical lectures. Previous topics have ranged from treating COVID-19 patients in low-resource settings, to administering antibiotics. These sessions are free to all of our local partners and we plan to offer even more in 2022. Through our elective course at The University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine, student-physicians have the opportunity to partner with these local health professionals and gain exposure to treating diverse populations.




### **VOLUNTEER MEDICAL CORPS**


