For more than a decade, The Addis Clinic has provided access to high-quality healthcare in some of the world's most challenging settings.



The first three months of 2022 were, for The Addis Clinic, an exciting time of growth and development. For the world at large ... quite the opposite. Russia's military aggression towards Ukraine has killed thousands, wounded tens of thousands, and displaced millions of people. They have destroyed vital infrastructure and disrupted already fragile food and supply chains for the parts of the world where we work. The Addis Clinic is not working in Europe or Asia, but the downstream effects of the conflict are clear throughout East Africa.

In the first quarter of 2022, we hired 22 new health workers in Somalia to deliver high quality maternal and infant healthcare. Our team in Kenya continues to build the capacity of more than 1,000 primary healthcare providers through access to comprehensive, evidence-based guidance and coaching. In an effort to improve access to healthcare, they are also facing terrorists, famine, and a lack of resources.

Our impact is growing, however, thanks to our local staff and our community of volunteers and donors. If you're reading this and you haven't considered joining us in one of those two ways, then I want you to know that 100% of all of your contributions will go directly to our programs. Our impact belongs to you. Thank you for the good that you bring to an often inhospitable world.

As I was setting up our mobile clinic one Saturday morning, a pregnant patient caught my eye. She was sitting outside the building we would later use for our community health class, patiently waiting with a young baby on her lap. After I finished setting up my medical tools and EMR software, I motioned for her to come and started her checkup. When I checked her blood pressure, I immediately knew something was wrong.

Combined with the swelling in her feet and hands and a few other symptoms, I knew the high blood pressure likely pointed towards preeclampsia, a deadly condition and one of the leading causes of maternal and fetal mortality in Kenya. She could not afford the fare for the one hour trip to the city for medical care. Her situation pained me, because I believe everyone deserves access to affordable healthcare. Fortunately, I helped her find free medical care and the next day arranged for her to travel to the city for additional testing and monitoring.

These are the challenges we face daily in Kwale County, Kenya, but it is the reason I wake up everyday— to educate girls, mothers, and pregnant women about sexual and reproductive health. We saved a mother's life that Saturday but there are many more who need help and thatthat makes me want to do more everyday.



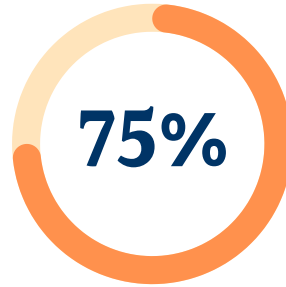
THE ACADEMY
